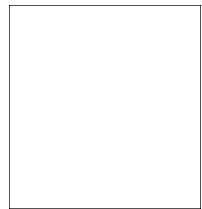

The mission of the Lincoln Theatre is to entertain, inform and inspire our diverse community through cinema, live performance and educational programs while preserving the Historic Lincoln Theatre.

**Bring sound to life...**...support the Lincoln Theatre in bringing state-of-the-art sound and hearing assistance to live performances and film.



- Enrich overall sound quality for audiences at live dramatic and musical performances
- Upgrade stage equipment to meet professional technical standards for performers
- Improve line of sight by moving speaker off the floor
- Provide quality sound for the hearing impaired

The \$150,000 campaign will allow the Lincoln Theatre to purchase and install:

- Stage monitors (6)
- Stage microphones & cabling
- Line array speakers hung from the ceiling
- Digital mixing console
- Wireless microphone system for up to 30 stage performers
- Hearing loop to transmit sound to hearing aids, cochlear implants and wireless receiving units
