### SOUND + HEARING CAMPAIGN

Bring on the sound....support the Lincoln Theatre in bringing state-of-the-art sound and hearing assistance to live performances.

- Enrich overall sound quality for audiences at live dramatic and musical performances
- Upgrade stage equipment to meet professional technical standards for performers
- Improve line of sight by moving speaker off the floor
- Provide quality sound for the hearing impaired

The \$150,000 campaign will allow purchase and installation of:

- Stage monitors (6)
- Stage microphones & cabling
- Line array speakers hung from the ceiling
- Digital mixing console
- Wireless microphone system for up to 30 stage performers
- Hearing loop to transmit sound to hearing aids, cochlear implants and wireless receiving units

It tells the story of the fictional American small town of Grover's Corners between 1901 and 1913 through the everyday lives of its citizens. Wilder sets the play in the actual theatre where it is being performed. The main character is the stage manager of the theatre who directly addresses the audience, brings in guest lecturers, fields questions from the audience, and fills in playing some of the roles.
