**Dee Doyle**

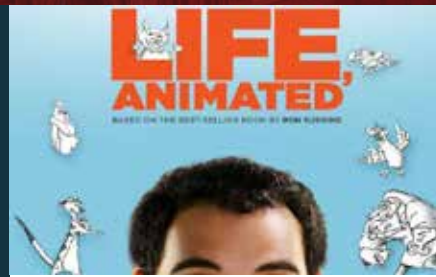
